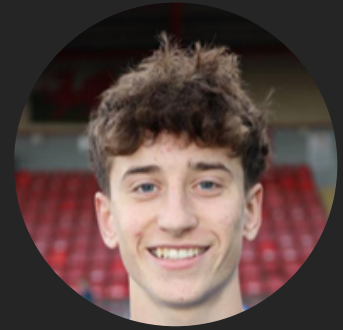

Prayer Space for Recovery brings the power of prayer to people living with alcohol and drug addiction. Based in Swansea, South Wales we create accessible prayer spaces before Alcoholics Anonymous and Cocaine Anonymous meetings.

This provides an opportunity for anyone in recovery to encounter prayer and connection with God and each other in a supportive and non-judgemental space. It is such a privilege to be part of and witness people profoundly encounter God every week. 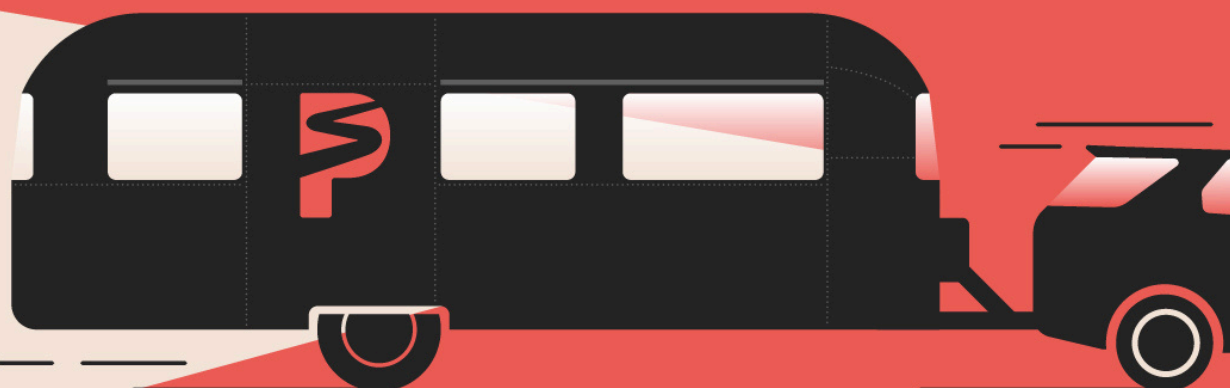

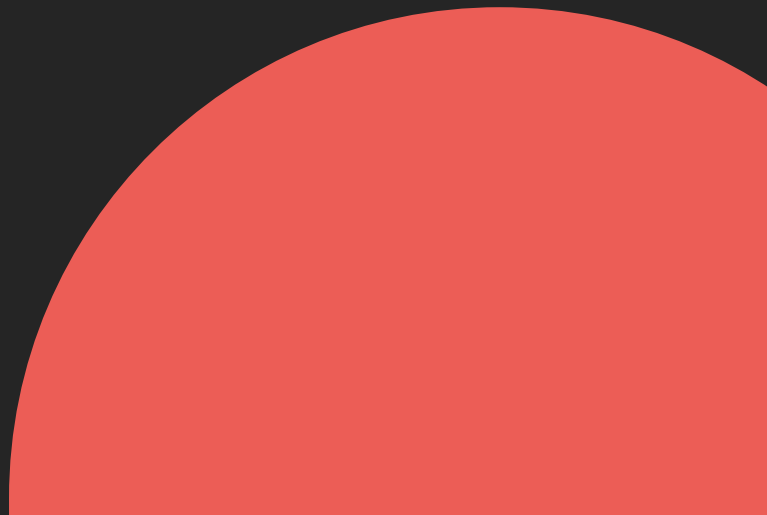
PRAYERSTREAM
